The ECOsystems Conference is a two-day, immersive conference experience built exclusively for Michigan Environmental Council member organizations–specifically the employees, board members and volunteers who power their work. We anticipate 100 attendees.

Our ECOs–environmental and conservation organizations–work on every conceivable environmental issue all across Michigan, from combatting local river pollution, to addressing honey bee habitats in urban communities, to advocating for better climate protection, and so much more. Together we'll learn, celebrate and inspire another year of action!

#### The Petoskey Prize Ceremony

Each year members of the Environmental Council nominate an outstanding volunteer for recognition with the Petoskey Prize. The prize includes a \$5,000 cash award for the nominating organization and a celebration of the winner. This year's Petoskey Prize winner is Sandra Sorini Elser, nominated by the Legacy Land Conservancy. We'll award the prize at the Petoskey Dinner on Sunday night. #### The Conference

On Monday we get down to work (with a little bit of play). The day consists of professional development sessions ranging from fundraising and communications trainings to strategic planning sessions for priority campaigns. Alongside that we're offering some fun breaks like a fly-casting seminar and a morning run through the fall foliage.

#### **The ECOprizes**

To celebrate good work done and to inspire the next great project, we'll award three \$10,000 prizes to conference participants. One prize will celebrate the most impactful project of the last year. Another will be given to seed the most exciting innovation or strategy for the coming year. The final will be a "people's choice" award for the project that most tickles attendees' fancies.

## **General Sponsorships**
